Sample Critical Listening Guide

CONTEXT

- 1. Where is the speaker located?
- 2. When was this text composed?
- 3. What do you know about the speaker's identity? (e.g., family, gender, race, age, religion, socioeconomic status, sexual orientation, abilities, interests, language).
- 4. How does the speaker's context or identity influence the content of this text (i.e., what the speaker says)?
- 5. How does the speaker's context or identity influence the way the text is presented (i.e., how the speaker says it)?

AUDIENCE

- 1. Who is the speaker's intended audience? How do you know?
- 2. Does the speaker make any assumption(s) about the audience? Explain.
- 3. What might a listener bring to this text that could influence the way she/he interprets the content?
- 4. How has the identity and context of the audience (the listener or responder) impacted what the speaker is saying and how she/he says it?

PURPOSE

- 1. What is the speaker's purpose in the text? What is she/he hoping to achieve?
- 2. How does the purpose of this text impact what the speaker says and how she/he says it?
- 3. Does relevant and sound reasoning support the speaker's claim? Explain.
- 4. In what ways does the speaker acknowledge or respond to viewpoints other than hers/his own?

VALUES

- 1. What values does the speaker communicate? How do you know?
- 2. How does the speaker's identity affect her/his values?
- 3. To what extent does the speaker help the listener understand her/his values?

STYLE

- 1. How would you describe the speaker's speaking style? Explain.
- 2. What tone does the speaker create? Explain.
- 3. How does the speaker's word choice further her/his message? What are those words and phrases?
- 4. How does the speaker's use of figurative language impact her/his message? The tone of the message?
- 5. What are the advantages and disadvantages of using this medium (i.e. audio) to present this speaker's topic?
